Washington Apple Pi Endows Scholarship at GMU

Bethesda, MD, September 24, 2016 – Washington Apple Pi (the “Pi”) has created an endowed fund at the Volgenau School of Engineering at George Mason University (GMU) in Fairfax, VA. The Washington Apple Pi Endowed Scholarship provides scholarship support for undergraduate and graduate students studying computer science.

The Pi is a community of Apple device users. One of the oldest Mac User Groups (MUGS), dating from the earliest days of Apple Inc., it conducts several member meetings each month around the DC Metro area, publishes podcasts of its speaker oriented “general meetings”, and provides members with email services and a tech forum.

The Pi is live on [Facebook](#) and [Twitter](#), uses [Meetup](#) to advertise its meetings, and streams meetings on [Ustream](#) and [Periscope](#). The Pi also promotes the reclamation activities of the [MacRecycle Clinic](#), which provides refurbished Macs to a range of needy programs and schools.

Pi President Ken Goldman noted, “The Pi philosophy has always been one of ‘users helping users.’ We are delighted to extend this philosophy forward for years to come by devoting some of our financial resources to help students of George Mason University.”

“We really appreciate Washington Apple Pi for making the connection between the education of Computer Science students and the success of companies like Apple in developing world-changing devices,” said Sanjeev Setia, the GMU Computer Science Department’s chair.

The first student will receive an award in fall 2016.
